Plagal 4th Mode

**Statement Regarding Developments in Medicine:
COVID-19 Vaccines & Immunizations**

*Christ “came not to heal the healthy, but the sick; not to save the righteous, but sinners”
(Mark 2:17)*

As the world continues to battle COVID-19, we are ever grateful to the frontline workers – including medical professionals, emergency responders, and scientists – for their unwavering dedication to making the world a better place.

In light of the same, given our clergy and lay faithful are seeking archpastoral guidance regarding developments in medicine, such as COVID-19 vaccines and immunizations, we offer the following guidance:

Scripture encourages us to respect and protect the body as the temple of God (1 Cor. 6:19). At the same time, it discourages us from either tempting or testing the Lord (Matt. 4:7). And as your spiritual shepherds, we affirm and assure you that it is neither wrong nor sinful to seek medical attention and advice. In fact, we welcome interventions that provide us more time for spiritual renewal and repentance.

We therefore encourage all of you – the clergy and lay faithful of our Church – to consult your physicians in order to determine the appropriate course of action for you, just as you do for surgeries, medications, and vaccinations, in cancer treatments and other ailments. Indeed, while your own bishop, priest, or spiritual father remains prepared to assist you with spiritual matters, your personal doctor will guide your individual medical decisions.

We trust that whatever course of action you and your doctor decide upon will also benefit the rest of the community. If we work together – in a spirit of sincere compassion and care for one another – we will soon be able to gather together as a *full* community in our churches once again. We miss you very much and eagerly await the day when we can *all* exchange the kiss of peace in the Divine Liturgy!

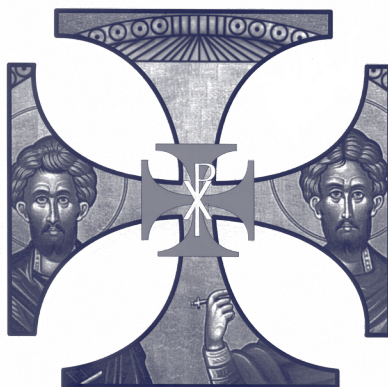

"Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord."

The General Epistle of the Apostle James (5:14)

Whether you need a pastoral visitation at home, in a hospital, rehabilitation facility, or the local coffee shop - Fr. George and Fr. Patrick are only a phone call, text message, or email away. You are NOT alone. Our clergy are always accessible and willing to meet your family's spiritual needs, especially during these trying times when we should all be turning to our Church/Spiritual Leaders for guidance, comfort and support. While unfortunately our clergy aren't Ghostbusters, neither are they mind-readers. Privacy laws have stopped the automatic updates that in decades past used to let them know when parishioners were hospitalized. Unless someone calls and tells them, they do NOT know that your loved ones are in for a checkup, a surgery, or end-of-life care. The proverbial grapevine is not reliable and puts the clergy in a difficult position. Please reach out to them directly to have them visit your loved ones anytime! As a result of the pandemic, fewer faithful have been attending church services regularly, limiting their contact with our church family and especially our clergy. Their pastoral service to any and all parishioners does not pause in a time like this, it should increase! So please, call them as soon as necessary and they will make sure your needs are met.

THE THREE HOLY HIERARCHS



My Beloved,

On January 30th every year we commemorate and celebrate the lives and teachings of the Three Hierarchs and Ecumenical Teachers, Saint Basil the Great, Saint Gregory the Theologian, and Saint John Chrysostom. Through their legacy of faith, piety, and divine wisdom, these three Holy Fathers have guided Christians throughout the centuries toward Jesus Christ and His promise of eternal life.

This important Feast coincides with the celebration of the Greek Letters, in which we acknowledge the fundamental importance of education in our lives as Greek Orthodox Christians and the critical importance of having qualified and dedicated Teachers who instill in our beloved children the lofty values of our Hellenic heritage, culture, language and history. For it is the Greek language that thousands of words in English can trace their roots to and it is the Greek language that is taught in over 2,000 universities across the world and studied by millions of students. The language that allowed Christianity to flourish and that today connects the modern scientific world is the language that our most dedicated Greek School Teachers and students are so immersed in, and so proud to teach and learn and share with the world.

"The three great luminaries of the Three-Sun Divinity have illumined all of the world with divine rays of doctrine." These are the poetic words which we hear in the Apolytikion for the Feast of the Three Hierarchs, for they truly lived

their lives as examples par excellence for all to emulate and to grow in faith and knowledge.


Each of these Fathers contributed their own individual gifts to the life of the Church: Basil was a man of action, establishing the first orphanage, the famous Basiliada, as well as numerous hospitals and other philanthropic centers; Gregory, most definitely earned the title of “theologian,” for he sought to uplift all of creation toward God, so that humanity could take its first step towards a mystical communion with God; and John Chrysostom combines the worldly activity of Basil with the theology of Gregory being at once “practical and theoretical, a pastor and an ascetic, an erudite scholar, and a dedicated believer.”

The influence of these three great fathers and saints on our Church cannot be understated. Each was immersed in Greek philosophy and the rhetorical methods of their age. They took philosophy, science and other worldly disciplines and sanctified them—they made them Christian. They recognized the value of education, and in particular, the education that is marked with Hellenic ideals and noble premises, that has been a beacon of light and the envy of the world throughout the centuries. Combining their Orthodox faith and their appreciation for Greek philosophy and virtues, the Three Hierarchs laid the foundation for generations to come. For indeed, having inherited their wise teachings and worthy principles, we are better Orthodox and better Hellenes today.

Στίς 30 Ιανουρίου ἡ Ἀγία μας Ἐκκλησία ἐορτάζει καί τιμᾶ τοὺς Τρεῖς Μεγάλους Ἱεράρχες καί Οἰκουμενικούς Δασκάλους «Βασίλειον τόν Μέγαν καί τόν Θεολόγον Γρηγόριον σύν τῷ κλεινῷ Ἰωάννῃ τῷ τήν γλῶτταν χρυσορρήμονι». Συγχρόνως καί ἡ Ἑλληνορθόδοξος Παιδεία τοὺς τιμᾶ ὡς προστάτες τῶν ἐλληνικῶν γραμμάτων, γιατί στό ἔργο τους ἔχουν ἔνυθει ἄρμονικά ἡ ὑγίης ἐλληνική σκέψη καί τό γνήσιο χριστιανικό ἦθος.

Οἱ Τρεῖς Ἱεράρχες ἀναγνωρίστηκαν διά μέσου τῶν αἰῶνων ὡς μοναδικά ὑποδείγματα Ἑλληνο-χριστιανικῆς ἀγωγῆς, ὄχι μόνο διότι κατεῖχαν τήν χριστιανική καί ἐλληνική σοφία, ἀλλά γιατί ἡ ζωῆ τους συμφωνοῦσε μέ ὅσα δίδασκαν. Πρῶτοι ἐκεῖνοι ἐπέδωκαν τήν ἀγιότητα στόν βίο τους καί στή συνέχεια τήν προσέφεραν σέ ἄλλους καί ὄλους. Μέ ἀπλά λόγια, ἔκαναν πράξη τά λόγια τοῦ Κυρίου μας: «ὁς δ' ἂν ποιήσῃ καί διδάξῃ οὗτος μέγας κληθήσεται ἐν τῇ βασιλείᾳ τῶν οὐρανῶν» (Ματθ. 5:19), δηλαδή ὅποιος θά κάνει πρῶτα πράξη καί ζωῆ τίς θείες ἐντολές καί δεύτερον τίς διδάξῃ σέ ἄλλους ἀνθρώπους, θά ὀνομαστῆ «Μέγας». Γι'αὐτόν ἀκριβῶς τόν λόγο ὀνομάστηκαν «Μεγάλοι» τῆς ἱστορίας, τῆς παιδείας, τῆς Ἐκκλησίας, τῆς ἀγιότητος.
