THADDOUS THE APOSTLE OF THE 70





Saint Moses, who is also called Moses the Black, was a slave, but because of his evil life, his master cast him out, and he became a ruthless thief, dissolute in all his ways. Later, however, coming to repentance, he converted, and took up the monastic life under Saint Isidore of Scete. He gave himself over to prayer and the mortification of the carnal mind with such diligence that he later became a priest of exemplary virtue. He was revered by all for his lofty ascetical life and for his great humility. Once the Fathers in Scete asked Moses to come to an assembly to judge the fault of a certain brother, but he refused. When they insisted, he took a basket which had a hole in it, filled it with sand, and carried it on his shoulders. When the Fathers saw him coming they asked him what the basket might mean. He answered, "My sins run out behind me, and I do not see them, and I am come this day to judge failings which are not mine." When a barbarian tribe was coming to Scete, Moses, conscious that he himself had slain other men when he was a thief, awaited them and was willingly slain by them with six other monks, at the end of the fourth century. He was a contemporary of Saint Arsenius the Great

THE EPISTLE



Prokeimenon:

The Lord is my strength and my song, and He became my salvation

Verse:

The Lord chastened and corrected me, but He did not give me up to death.

The reading is from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians (9:2~12)

Brethren, you are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord. This is my defense to those who would examine me. Do we not have the right to our food and drink? Do we not have the right to be accompanied by a wife, as the other apostles and the brothers of the Lord and Cephas? Or is it only Barnabas and I who have no right to refrain from working for a living? Who serves as a soldier at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard without eating any of its fruit? Who tends a flock without getting some of the milk? Do I say this on human authority? Does not the law say the same? For it is written in the law of Moses, "You shall not muzzle an ox when it is treading out the grain." Is it for oxen that God is concerned? Does he not speak entirely for our sake? It was written for our sake, because the plowman should plow in hope and the thresher thresh in hope of a share in the crop. If we have sown spiritual good among you, is it too much if we reap your material benefits? If others share this rightful claim upon you, do not we still more? Nevertheless, we have not made use of this right, but we endure anything rather than put an obstacle in the way of the gospel of Christ.

The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew (18:23~35)

The Lord said this parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the reckoning, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents; and as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. So the servant fell on his knees, imploring him, 'Lord, have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' And out of pity for him the lord of that servant released him and forgave him the debt. But that same servant, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat he said, 'Pay what you owe.' So his fellow servant fell down and besought him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' He refused and went and put him in prison till he should pay the debt. When his fellow servants saw what had taken place, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you besought me; and should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?' And in anger his lord delivered him to the jailors, till he should pay all his debt. So also my heavenly Father will do to everyone of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart."

HCA Presents Faith and Fervor History Books to Sunday School Senior Graduates

In its ongoing efforts to preserve and pass along the rich history of the Greeks in Utah, the Hellenic Cultural Association (HCA) presented the acclaimed history book Faith and Fervor to 16 graduating seniors of our Sunday School program.

The presentation was among the dinner celebration that honored the students and their dedicated teachers on Saturday, August 14, at the Prophet Elias Church hall.

Recipients of the book were Zachary Burton, Ashley Carras, Demetrios (Traki) Gerontis, Roula Karahalios, John Katzourakis, Paraskevoula Limantzakis, George Makris, Anna Melonas, Laurisa Melonas, Dena Moutsos, Maria Nedelcu, Sophia Olson, Michael Petrogeorge, Telly Priskos, Panos Saltaris, and Athan Skedros.

The book is based on files and records gathered by the late Greek community historian, Constantine Skedros. It was published in conjunction with the HCA in 2005 to commemorate the 100-year anniversary of the Greek Orthodox Church in Utah. The first church of the early community was located at 440 West 400 South. A monument, erected there by the HCA in 2011, commemorates the site.



2022 GOCGSL Stewardship Guidelines – Effective August 10, 2022

Definitions:

Godparents: Members of The Greek Orthodox Church in good standing who plan to sponsor a new member.

Koumbaroi: Members of The Greek Orthodox Church in good standing who plan to stefanosi a couple being wed in our church.

Sacrament: a religious ceremony or ritual regarded as imparting divine grace, such as baptism, weddings, funerals, the Eucharist, and (in the Roman Catholic and many Orthodox Churches) penance and the anointing of the sick. Sacraments are performed upon members of our church who are being or have been baptized.

Stewardship: The job of supervising or taking care of something, such as an organization or property.

Steward: Manage or look after.

Steward in the eyes of the GOCGSL: A steward is a member of our parish that contributes financially, as well as their time and talent, to the betterment of our community. We believe that those who participate in the ministries of our church – altar boys, choir members, dance members, Philoptochos, and many others, that help sustain and feed our community, so it grows and thrives, are stewards.

What we need:

Financial Situation: The financial cost to run our parish is around \$3,835 per day. This covers the salaries of the clergy, office staff, and custodians, as well as operational maintenance, utility bills, and general upkeep. Currently, our church has 500 stewards. In order to cover our operating budget of \$1,400,000, the average commitment is \$2,800 per steward or family. We certainly understand that there are members of our community that would struggle with this amount, and in those cases, please discuss what you are able to contribute with Father George Nikas.

Major Budgetary Events This Fiscal Year: In preparation for the development of our new downtown campus, and the safety of the Salt Lake City Community at large, the La France Apartments were demolished. As La France provided needed additional income to the parish that is no longer available, we ask and encourage all able stewards to increase their financial commitment to our church, so we can continue to thrive and grow.

Age of a Steward: The GOCGSL recognizes a steward as a member of our parish that contributes financially, as well as their time and talents, to the betterment of our community. While we deem all members who contribute to our church ministries as stewards, we ask all members to become fully independent, financially donating stewards, outside of their parental umbrella, beginning at age 22.

Sacraments:

Participating in a sacrament with no obligation of additional contributions is a privilege of being a steward. If you wish to become a GOCGSL steward and continue participating in the life of the church, you have the option of applying any contribution from a sacrament toward your stewardship.

Baptisms:

Candidates for baptism: Individuals being baptized must be paid stewards of our parish, or in the case of a child baptism, the parents of the child must be paid stewards of our parish for the past two consecutive years. Parents wishing to baptize their children in our parish who are not paid stewards for the past two consecutive years are asked to contribute \$750 for the use of Holy Trinity Cathedral or Prophet Elias Church, paid no later than 30 days prior to the baptism.

Godparents: All godparents must be paid stewards of our parish for the past two consecutive years. A godparent who is not a paid steward of our parish for the past two consecutive years is asked to contribute \$500 for the use of Holy Trinity Cathedral or Prophet Elias Church, paid no later than 30 days prior to the baptism. Godparents from parishes outside of ours may have a letter sent to our priest from their home priest verifying that they are in good standing, to eliminate any additional contributions.

Weddings:

Candidates for marriage: At least one member of the couple being married must be a paid steward of our parish for the past two consecutive years. Couples who do not fulfill this requirement are asked to contribute \$1,500 for the use of Holy Trinity Cathedral or Prophet Elias Church, paid no later than 30 days prior to the wedding.

Koumbaroi: All koumbaroi must be paid stewards of our parish for the past two consecutive years. Koumbaroi who are not paid stewards of our parish for the past two consecutive years are asked to contribute \$500 for the use of Holy Trinity Cathedral or Prophet Elias Church, paid no later than 30 days prior to the wedding. Koumbaroi from parishes outside of ours may have a letter sent to our priest from their home priest verifying that they are in good standing, to eliminate any additional contributions.


