

## Epistle Reading

### Acts of the Apostles 16:16-34



IN THOSE DAYS, as we apostles were going to the place of prayer, we were met by a slave girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners much gain by soothsaying. She followed Paul and us, crying, "These men are servants of the Most High God, who proclaim to you the way of salvation." And this she did for many days. But Paul was annoyed, and turned and said to the spirit, "I charge you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour. But when her owners saw that their hope of gain was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the market place before


the rulers; and when they had brought them to the magistrates they said, "These men are Jews and they are disturbing our city. They advocate customs which it is not lawful for us Romans to accept or practice." The crowd joined in attacking them; and the magistrates tore the garments off them and gave orders to beat them with rods. And when they had inflicted many blows upon them, they threw them into prison, charging the jailer to keep them safely. Having received this charge, he put them into the inner prison and fastened their feet in the stocks. But about midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them, and suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and every one's fetters were unfastened. When the jailer woke, and saw that the prison doors were open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, supposing that the prisoners had escaped. But Paul cried with a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." And he called for lights and rushed in, and trembling with fear he fell down before Paul and Silas, and brought them out and said, "Men, what must I do to be saved?" And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." And they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all that were in his house. And he took them the same hour of the night, and washed their wounds, and he was baptized at once, with all his family. Then he brought them up into his house, and set food before them; and he rejoiced with all his household that he had believed in God.



## **Gospel Reading**

### **The Gospel According to John 9:1-38**



At that time, as Jesus passed by, he saw a man blind from his birth. And his disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be made manifest in him. We must work the works of him who sent me, while it is day; night comes, when no one can work. As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." As he said this, he spat on the ground and made clay of the spittle and anointed the man's eyes with the clay, saying to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which means Sent).

So, he went and washed and came back seeing. The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar, said, "Is not this the man who used to sit and beg?" Some said, "It is he"; others said, "No, but he is like him." He said, "I am the man." They said to him, "Then how were your eyes opened?" He answered, "The man called Jesus made clay and anointed my eyes and said to me, 'Go to Siloam and wash'; so, I went and washed and received my sight." They said to him, "Where is he?" He said, "I do not know." They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind. Now it was a Sabbath day when Jesus made the clay and opened his eyes. The Pharisees again asked him how he had received his sight. And he said to them, "He put clay on my eyes and I washed, and I see." Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for he does not keep the Sabbath." But others said, "How can a man who is a sinner do such signs?" There was a division among them. So, they again said to the blind man, "What do you say about him, since he has opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet." The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight, until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight, and asked them, "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How then does he now see?" His parents answered, "We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind; but how he now sees we do not know, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him; he is of age; he will speak for himself." His parents said this because they feared the Jews, for the Jews had already agreed that if anyone should confess him to be Christ he was to be put out of the synagogue. Therefore, his parents said, "He is of age, ask him."

So, for the second time they called the man who had been blind, and said to him, "Give God the praise; we know that this man is a sinner." He answered, "Whether he is a sinner, I do not know; one thing I know, that though I was blind, now I see." They said to him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" He answered them, "I have told you already and you would not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you too want to become his disciples?" And they reviled him, saying, "You are his disciple, but we are disciples of Moses. We know that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this man, we do not know where he comes from." The man answered, "Why, this is a marvel! You do not know where he comes from, and yet he opened my eyes. We know that God does not listen to sinners, but if anyone is a worshiper of God and does his will, God listens to him. Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a man born blind. If this man were not from God, he could do nothing." They answered him, "You were born in utter sin, and would you teach us?" And they cast him out. Jesus heard that they had cast him out, and having found him he said, "Do you believe in the Son of man?" He answered, "And who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and it is he who speaks to you." He said, "Lord, I believe": and he worshiped him.

My Dear Beloved Family in Our Risen Lord,

This Wednesday, May 24<sup>th</sup>, on the sixth week of Pascha our Holy Orthodox Church celebrates the Apodosis or Leave-taking of the Feast of Feasts – Holy Pascha. This will be the last time we as Orthodox will joyfully proclaim and greet each other with Christ Is Risen. This celebration is different from most leave-taking celebrations which are celebrated after the eighth day of the feast day, because Pascha the Feast of Feasts has its leave-taking on the 39<sup>th</sup> day. The 40<sup>th</sup> day is the day of our Lord's Ascension and the last day of our Lord's physical presence here on earth. He does not forsake us though as he promised "He will be with us even unto the end of the age" (Matt. 20:28). Each major feast day has its leave-taking celebration because it affords us the opportunity to celebrate the joyful beauty of the feast day once again. We all enjoy a special time, and the beauty of a celebration and we can experience that again with the celebration of the leave-taking. It's like a very special and delicious meal that we have enjoyed and we desire to have and eat again. The major feasts of our Church are the sweetness to our souls and arouse in us the desire to celebrate the feast day more than once.

Pascha is this extra special sweetness and joy we experience and being the Feast of Feasts we celebrate the victory of Christ's Resurrection for 40 days. Please enjoy the following as presented by Peter Souvall at Holy Trinity on May 7, 2017:

Almost all Greek churches take one of 3 shapes. The first one, rather obviously, is in the shape of the cross. The second is in the shape of a circle. The third main shape that churches have is a ship. But why are some churches modeled after a ship? A ship symbolizes stewards working together, and as stewards we must row together in order to propel our ship, our church, forward to achieve our goals.

Working together has been a hallmark of our community since it first started. When Greek miners first came to west at the turn of the century young men would often live together in groups of 4-5. A large majority of these young men were miners and at the time working conditions for miners were deplorable. Despite all of their hardships these young men still proved they were great and valuable stewards. For example, one of the men would donate his entire paycheck to the building of churches in Utah. While his friends would support him. Each would take his turn doing this. These men, and later women, were the bricks that created the foundation for the Greek Orthodox Churches, as we know them today.

Stewardship isn't just donating money; it includes donating time, talent, and energy. We must each ask ourselves, what has God given us and how would we like to offer these back to our community. There are many ways to do this including; Volunteering at philanthropic events, helping teach Sunday school, or even just helping a young Goya basketball player learn the game. One steward no matter how talented cannot move the ship. But if we work together, collectively, we can move the ship forward. So, grab an oar and start rowing for your church and for your community.
