We put no obstacle in any one's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we commend ourselves in

every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, tumults, labors, watching, hunger; by purity, knowledge, forbearance, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold we live; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.




GOYA BASKETBALL

Christian Stewardship is...

A grateful and responsible use of God's gifts in the light of God's purpose as revealed in Jesus Christ. Christian stewards, empowered by the Holy Spirit, commit themselves to conscious, purposeful decisions.

Stewardship is lived out in:

- living and telling the Good News;
- sharing with God in seeking justice, peace, and the integrity of creation in an interdependent universe;
- wisely employing God-given human resources, abilities, and relationships;
- sharing the material resources we hold and giving them in service, justice, and compassion;
- · providing for future generations;
- sharing in the life, worship, and responsible stewardship of the Church and of its mission.

Both for the individual and for the community, stewardship is a joyful act for the sake of God's world.

A **donation** is a <u>gift</u> given typically for <u>charitable</u> purposes and/or to benefit a cause. A donation may take various forms, including <u>cash offering</u>, <u>services</u>, new or used goods including <u>clothing</u>, <u>toys</u>, <u>food</u>, and <u>vehicles</u>. It also may consist of emergency, relief or <u>humanitarian aid</u> items, development aid support, and can also relate to medical care needs

Charitable gifts of goods or services are also called gifts in kind.
