Resurrectional Apolytikion

Grave Mode

By means of Your Cross, O Lord, You abolished death. To the robber You opened Paradise. The lamentation of the myrrh-bearing women You transformed, and You gave Your Apostles the order to proclaim to all that You had risen, O Christ our God, and granted the world Your great mercy.

Apolytikion of Pentecost (for the Holy Trinity) Plagal 4th Mode Blessed are You, O Christ our God, who made fishermen all-wise, sending upon them the Holy Spirit and, through them, netting the world. O Loving One, glory to You.

Apolytikion of the Prophet Elias

4th Mode

The incarnate Angel, the Cornerstone of the Prophets, the second Forerunner of the Coming of Christ, the glorious Elias (Elijah), who from above, sent down to Elisha the grace to dispel sickness and cleanse lepers, abounds therefore in healing for those who honor him.

Kontakion

Plagal 2nd Mode

O guide to wisdom, provider of prudence, disciplinarian of fools, and defender of the poor, fortify and discipline my heart, O Master; You, give me a word, O Word of the Father. For behold, I will not hinder my lips from crying to You: O merciful Lord, have mercy on me who have fallen.

THE EPISTLE



Prokeimenon: Pray and return to the Lord Your God. Verse: In Judah God is known; His name is great in Israel.

The reading is from Paul's First Letter to the Romans. (13:11-14; 14:1-4)

Brethren, salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed; the night is far gone, the day is at hand. Let us then cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires. As for the man who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not for disputes over opinions. One believes he may eat anything, while the weak man eats only vegetables. Let not him who eats despise him who abstains, and let not him who abstains pass judgment on him who eats; for God has welcomed him. Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before his own master that he stands or falls. And he will be upheld, for God is able to make him stand.

And when you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by men but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

Dear fellow parishioners,

It is with great pride that I inform you the Greek Orthodox Church of Greater Salt Lake and the Hellenic Cultural Association are in the process of observing the 200th anniversary of the independence of Greece the week of March, 25, 2021 in a nationally significant manner.

Our parish and the HCA plan to present the citizens of Utah a large Greek flag that recently was flown atop of the flagpole at the Acropolis in Athens, Greece where a blue and white banner was ceremoniously flown on March 25, 1821 to signal the end of 400 years of Ottoman (Turkish) rule over Greece.

The commemorative flag is a gift from H.E. the President of the Hellenic Republic Katerina Sakellaropoulou, the HCA and the Greeks of Salt Lake City. A certification letter from the Presidential guard accompanied the flags.

In a letter to us, the public relations director for the president, Maya Solomou, wrote: "President Sakellaropoulou would like to compliment the Greek Orthodox Community of Greater Salt Lake and the Hellenic Cultural Association on their project to observe the bicentennial anniversary of the independence of Greece, which constitutes an event of major significance."

The gift from our parish – very likely the only one like it in the U.S. – resulted from a suggestion by parishioner and HCA board member Mike Korologos.

Through the efforts of Mike, his brother Tom who is the former U.S. Ambassador to Belgium and Nick Larigakis, president and chief executive officer of the American Hellenic Institute in Washington D.C. The flag idea became a reality earlier this month when we received two commemorative banners from President Sakellaropoulou.

We extend a special thank you to Mike, his brother Tom, Mr. Larigakis and the AHI for the idea and assistance in making it a distinctive reality.

We hope to present one commemorative flag to Utah Gov. Spencer Cox during the week of March 25 (depending on the governor's schedule), at which time he will sign a proclamation declaring March 25, 2021 as "Greek Independence Day in Utah".

A duplicate commemorative flag also flown on the pole at the Acropolis is planned for display at the HCA museum in the lower level of the Holy Trinity Cathedral.

The commemorative flags were accompanied by a letter from the Commander of the Presidential Guard in Athens certifying the flags were raised on the Acropolis pole. Photographs of those ceremonies were included with the flags. (see reverse)

Other bicentennial observance activities planned by our church are: During the week of March 25, the HCA will place 200 6"x8" flags, and a banner on the lawns of both Holy Trinity Cathedral and Prophet Elias Greek Orthodox Church in honor of the bicentennial.

The Very Rev. George Nikas and Rev. Patrick O'Rourke will conduct a liturgy Thursday, March 25, 10 a.m. at Holy Trinity Cathedral, followed by a Doxology commemorating the 200-year anniversary of Greek Independence.


