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




# 5TH SATURDAY OF LENT: THE AKATHIST HYMN



About the year 626, the Persians, Avars, and Slavs came with a great host and besieged the imperial city of Constantinople while the Emperor Heraclius and the main body of the Byzantine army were absent in the East. Enemy ships filled the sea, especially the Golden Horn, and on land the adversaries were ready for attack with foot-soldiers, horses, and engines of war. Though the citizens courageously withstood them, yet they were few in number and would be unable to repulse the attack of such a great host. Hence, they could not count on any other means of salvation, except the protection of the Theotokos. And truly, suddenly a violent tempest broke up all



the ships and submerged them, and the bodies of the invaders were cast out near the Blachernae quarter of the city where the famous Church of the Theotokos stood. Taking courage from this, the people went forth from the city and repulsed the remaining forces, who fled out of fear. In 673, the city was miraculously delivered yet again, this time from an invasion of the Arabs. Then in 717-718, led by the Saracen general Maslamah, the Arab fleet laid siege once more to the city. The numerical superiority of the enemy was so overwhelming that the fall of the Imperial City seemed imminent. But then the Mother of God, together with a multitude of the angelic hosts, appeared suddenly over the city walls. The enemy forces, struck with terror and thrown into a panic at this apparition, fled in disarray. Soon after this, the Arab fleet was utterly destroyed by a terrible storm in the Aegean Sea on the eve of the Annunciation, March 24, 718. Thenceforth, a special "feast of victory and of thanksgiving" was dedicated to celebrate and commemorate benefactions. In this magnificent service, the Akathist Hymn is prominent and holds the place of honour. It appears that even before the occasion of the enemy assaults mentioned above, the Akathist Hymn was already in use as the prescribed Service for the Feast of the Annunciation, together with the kontakion, "When the bodiless one learned the secret command," which has the Annunciation as its theme. It was only on the occasion of the great miracle wrought for the Christian populace of the Imperial City on the eve of the Annunciation in 718 that the hymn "To thee, the Champion Leader" was composed, most likely by Saint Germanus, Patriarch of Constantinople.

With the rivers of your tears you made the barren desert bloom; and with your sighs from deep within, you made your labors bear their fruits a hundredfold; and you became a star, illuminating the world by your miracles, O John, our devout father. Intercede with Christ our God, for the salvation of our souls.

## Apolytikion of Pentecost (for the Holy Trinity)

Blessed are You, O Christ our God, who made fishermen all-wise, sending upon them the Holy Spirit and, through them, netting the world. O Loving One, glory to You.

## Apolytikion of the Prophet Elias

The incarnate Angel, the Cornerstone of the Prophets, the second Forerunner of the Coming of Christ, the glorious Elias (Elijah), who from above, sent down to Elisha the grace to dispel sickness and cleanse lepers, abounds therefore in healing for those who honor him.

### **Kontakion**

O Champion General, I your City now inscribe to you Triumphant anthems as the tokens of my gratitude, Being rescued from the terrors, O Theotokos. Inasmuch as you have power unassailable, From all kinds of perils free me, so that unto you I may cry aloud: Rejoice, O unwedded Bride.

Brethren, when God made a promise to Abraham, since he had no one greater by whom to swear, he swore to himself, saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you." And thus Abraham, having patiently endured, obtained the promise. Men indeed swear by a greater than themselves, and in all their disputes an oath is final for confirmation. So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he interposed with an oath, so that through two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible that God should prove false, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to seize the hope set before us. We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner shrine behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek."

## The reading is from the holy Gospel according to Mark

(9:17-31)

At that time, a man came to Jesus kneeling and saying: "Teacher, I brought my son to you, for he has a dumb spirit; and wherever it seizes him it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, and they were not able." And he answered them, "O faithless generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him to me." And they brought the boy to him; and when the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. And Jesus asked his father, "How long has he had this?" And he said, "From childhood. And it has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you can do anything, have pity on us and help us." And Jesus said to him, "If you can! All things are possible to him who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!" And when Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You dumb and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him, and never enter him again." And after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse; so that most of them said. "He is dead." But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose. And when he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer and fasting." They went on from there and passed through Galilee. And he would not have any one know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of man will be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him; and when he is killed, after three days he will rise."

# The Hellenic Cultural Association's Holy Trinity Church Through the Years

The first "Holy Liturgy" at the new Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church in downtown Salt Lake City occurred Aug. 15, 1924. On the following Aug. 2, 1925 it was the scene of the consecration services.

- Greek churches are not consecrated until their mortgages are paid in full. The immigrants accomplished that feat by raising \$150,00 (approx. \$2.7 million today) in two years.
- News reports at the time noted that more than 700 were in attendance for the first service and immigrant workers (most all men) from distant locales travelled to the event by stage coach and train.
- Ceremonies began with a parade from the original Holy Trinity Church on 400 South and 438 West to the new one.
- At the ceremony Utah Gov. Charles Maybe commented: "This building is evidence the Greek residents of Utah intend to make their home here and assist in the upbuilding of the community. We are going to work together."
- Members of the Holy Trinity Church board of directors in 1924 included Bill Karapanos, Nick Kasambas, James Mavrakis, Phillip Drandakis, James Lambros, Odysseus Pappaspiridis and Nicholas Melis.
- Church leaders officiating at the consecration were P.S. Marthakis, chairman; John George, Archimandrite Barthalomeos Karahalios, George N. Strike, John G. Condos, Peter E. Athas and William Cayias.
- Salt Lake City's Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church was added to the National Historical Registry and the Utah State Register of Historical Sites in 1974.
- In 1986 Holy Trinity Church was elevated to Cathedral Status after elaborate ceremonies.

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In Adam and Eve, we were made in God's "image and likeness"; Adam lost "the likeness", but Jesus is the New Man, the full "image and likeness" of God. One of God's essential characteristics is Holiness. Jesus is the real Holy Man and, in Him, all of us can become holy, Saints, His icons for those around us unto ours and their salvation.

"Suffering and challenges..."

The Western Christendom teaches, "Jesus suffered on the Cross FOR us", that "He paid the

Debt" we incurred in Adam and Eve. It is a legalistic approach to salvation and it can harm us when facing pain and suffering. The Eastern Christianity believes that "Jesus's suffering on the Cross is, not only FOR us, but also IN us", that His suffering expands in our own, making pain and suffering an OPPORTUNITY for salvation, rather than a tragedy"

Fr. Dan was born on August 27, 1955 in Dumbraveni, central Transylvania, Romania. After graduating high school, he graduated in 1979 from the Theological Orthodox Institute of Sibiu, Romania and got admitted to the doctoral classes in theology at the Theological Institute of Bucharest. In September of 1982, he received a scholarship at the Princeton Theological Seminar to work on his doctoral thesis in Pastoral Theology. In January 1984, he accepted Archbishop Victorin's call to work as a missionary for the Romanian Orthodox Missionary Archdiocese of North America. He spent 10 years in parishes in Canada after which he worked in parishes in the U.S. He was accepted in the GOA in 1996 and has been part of the Metropolis of Denver ever since. Fr. Dan is married to Delia Mihaiela and they are the parents of Sylvia (John) and Christopher, and grandparents of Daniel and Anna. Fr. Dan is presently retired and lives in San Antonio, Texas.
