



PENTECOST





Fifty days after the Resurrection, on the Jewish feast of Pentecost ("Shavuot," celebrating the first fruits of the annual wheat harvest) while the disciples and many other followers of lesus Christ were gathered together to pray, the Holy Spirit descended upon them in the form of "cloven tongues of fire," with the sound of a mighty rushing wind, and they began to speak in languages that they did not know. There were many visitors from the Jewish diaspora to lerusalem at that time for the lewish observance of the feast, and they were astonished to hear

these untaught fisherman speaking praises to God in their alien tongues. This account is detailed in the Acts of the Apostles, chapter 2.

The number fifty, as in the fiftieth day after Pascha, stands for eternal and heavenly fulfillment, seven times seven, plus one.

The Orthodox Church sees Pentecost as the final fulfillment of the mission of Jesus Christ and the first beginning of the messianic age of the Kingdom of God, mystically present in his Church. It is traditionally called the beginning of the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church.

Besides celebrating the coming of the Holy Spirit, the feast also celebrates the full revelation of the divine Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Hymns of the Church, celebrate the sign of the final act of God's self-disclosure to the world of His creation.

To Orthodox Christians, the feast of Pentecost is not just a celebration of an event in history. It is also a celebration their membership in the Church. They have lived Pentecost and received "the seal of the gift of the Holy Spirit" in the sacrament of chrismation.

THE EPISTLE



Prokeimenon: Their proclamation went forth into all the earth, and their words to the ends of the world.

Verse: The heavens declare the glory of God; the firmament shows the creation of His hands.

The reading is from the Acts of the Apostles.

(2:1-11)

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontos and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

THE GOSPEL



The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to John. (7:37-52; 8:12)

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as the scripture has said, 'Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water." Now this he said about the Spirit, which those who believed in him were to receive; for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified. When they heard these words, some of the people said, "This is really the prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee? Has not the scripture said that the Christ is descended from David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" So there was a division among the people over him. Some of them wanted to arrest him, but no one laid hands on him. The officers then went back to the chief priest and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring him?" The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this man!" The Pharisees answered them, "Are you led astray, you also? Have any of the authorities or of the Pharisees believed in him? But this crowd, who do not know the law, are accursed." Nikodemos, who had gone to him before, and who was one of them, said to them, "Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and you will see that no prophet is to rise from Galilee." Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

PARISH ASSEMBLY RECAP

Beloved Parishioners,

It was wonderful to see so many faces at our Spring Parish Assembly held May 23rd. After a two year hiatus because of the COVID pandemic, an in person meeting was finally able to be held. I can't tell you how much I truly enjoyed seeing so many faces, with or without masks. It seems that we are moving into normalcy with expediency in our great State. I truly believe that we will be back to normal sooner than later.

The following is a summary recap of the meeting for those who were not able to attend.

Financials: Our treasurer (Elpitha Votsis) presented a glowing report on our financial status. She presented a full 2020 report as well as the first quarter of 2021. We are doing very well and moving in the right direction, please keep your stewardship commitments coming in. The credit for this positive direction goes directly to you; if it were not for your commitment to our great parish, we would not be where we are today.

Clergy Report: Fr. George reflected on the last 4 years since being assigned to our historic community on June 1, 2017. He also thanked Fr. Patrick, the Parish Council, Philoptochos and Office Staff for their excellent synergistic cooperation, work and dedication. Fr. Patrick gave an update on all Youth activities and as Chairman of the Iconography Committee presented a 3-phase plan of iconography and beautification to complete the interior of Prophet Elias Church. The Parish Assembly approved Phase 1 (Iconography). It is anticipated that the Pantorcrator will be completed and installed by Christmas 2021.

President's Report: We observed a beautiful March 25th celebration highlighted by a visit and proclamation from Utah Governor Spencer Cox at HT Cathedral. On Sunday, August 15th the Cretan organization will host a Panayia's picnic at

the PE pavilion. Our annual Greek Festival (Sept 10-12) will return this year bigger and better than ever. Please make every effort to volunteer your time and help the wonderful people chairing booths this year.

Cornerstone Project: The real estate committee presented an offer by Woodbury Developers as they continue to work towards our downtown development: \$750K for the first three years and 6% of net rents thereafter. A motion was made to have further discussion at a Special Parish Assembly which will be held on Sunday, July 18th at PE, after church services.

Philoptochos Report: Philoptochos presented all the wonderful philanthropic projects they have been doing and will be doing, even during the pandemic. Philoptochos has continued to a beacon of light and outreach for our church community during these trying times.


