Saint Anatolius was a priest from Alexandria, who had been ordained deacon and perhaps also priest by Saint Cyril, Archbishop of Alexandria. In 449, at the Robber Council of Ephesus, Saint Cyril's infamous successor, the violent Dioscorus, unlawfully deposed Flavian, the Patriarch of Constantinople and opponent of the Monophysite Eutyches; Flavian, from the beatings which he received, died soon after. Dioscorus, thinking that the priest Anatolius would support him, consecrated him Patriarch of Constantinople in Saint Flavian's stead. After he had been consecrated by Dioscorus-who at that time had not yet been deposed-Anatolius united with the Orthodox; before the Council of Chalcedon in 451, he held a council of the Bishops in Constantinople, at which the Orthodox "Tome" of Pope Leo (see Feb. 18), which Dioscorus had not allowed to be read at the Robber Council. was read and approved; and at the Council of Chalcedon in 451, he condemned Nestorius, Eutyches, and, for his unlawful actions, Dioscorus. Saint Anatolius reposed in the year 458. Some ascribe to this Anatolius the hymns of Vespers and the Praises in the Octoechos that are labeled Anatolian Stichera; but others (which may be more correct), to another with the same name, who was from the Monastery of Studium, and a disciple of Saint Theodore the Studite, whose epistle to this Anatolius is still extant.

The reading is from Paul's Letter to the Romans (5:1-10)

Brethren, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in our hope of sharing the glory of God. More than that, we rejoice in our knowing that suffering produces endurance, sufferings. endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit which has been given to us. While we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Why, one will hardly die for a righteous man-though perhaps for a good man one will dare even to die. But God shows his love for us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us. Since, therefore, we are now justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life.

The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew (6:22-33)

The Lord said, "The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is sound, your whole body will be full of light; but if your eye is not sound, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness! No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you shall eat or what you shall drink, nor about your body, what you shall put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And which of you by being anxious can add one cubit to his span of life? And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O men of little faith? Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear? For the Gentiles seek all these things; and your heavenly Father knows you need them all. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well."



Beloved Stewards and Friends,

I pray that my Pastoral Letter finds all of you basking in the sun's rays during these lazy summer days. Summer is a time for all of us to rejuvenate ourselves physically and spiritually in preparation for an exciting and dynamic Ecclesiastical Year ahead, starting with our Annual Greek Festival in early September.

This summer will bring some unique challenges and opportunities to our Parish with the reassignment of Fr. Patrick, who will be sorely missed, and the subsequent reality of having only one Priest meeting all of the various needs of our sizable Community. In an effort to keep everyone informed, I have deemed it beneficial to communicate with all of you at this time regarding the following items:

New Assistant Priest

We are doing everything we can to get a new Assistant Priest assigned to our beloved Community as soon as possible. However, the fact remains that there are around 50 parishes that need a priest and there are few clergy, if any, available at this time that would be a good match for our needs. Many parishes do not even have one priest, let alone two priests. There are also a number of parishes that are larger than ours that are in need of a second priest and have been waiting for some time. Of course, the fact that we have two Churches necessitates us having at least two priests physically present for Sundays, and I am hopeful that our special circumstance will propel us to the "top" of the waiting list. Until we get a new Assistant Priest, with Metropolitan Isaiah's blessings, Fr. Luke Kontgas has offered his assistance for most Sunday services (to keep both churches open). I ask for your collective prayers in finding the appropriate Clergyman to assist Fr. George and become a vital member of our Community Family.

Scheduling Sacraments

Effective immediately, please remember to schedule all Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals directly with Fr. George. Memorials and 40-day Churchings (babies) should be scheduled through the Church Office.

Clergy-Laity Congress

Fr. George, George Karahalios and Archon Nick Bapis will be representing our Parish at the Clergy-Laity Congress in NYC from July 3-8. Please pray for a successful Clergy-Laity Congress as this year's event will be celebrating the 100th Anniversary of our Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America.



Fulltime Youth Director

In an effort to revitalize our Youth Ministry and Programs, the Parish Council, upon the request of Fr. George, has authorized the hiring of a Fulltime Youth Director. The Youth Director will work closely with Fr. George and parent Youth Advisors to ensure that our Youth Programs will be well coordinated and robust this coming Ecclesiastical Year. As we slowly emerge from the Covid pandemic and after having a restful summer, I pray that our Youth will be back in September in full force, ready for an exciting and spiritually fulfilling year ahead!


