

Your Martyrs, O Lord, were worthily awarded by You the crowns of incorruption, in that they contested for You our immortal God. Since they possessed Your power, they defeated the tyrants, dashing the demons' powerless displays of defiance. O Christ God, at their fervent entreaties, save our souls.

Apolytikion of Pentecost (for the Holy Trinity)

Blessed are You, O Christ our God, who made fishermen all-wise, sending upon them the Holy Spirit and, through them, netting the world. O Loving One, glory to You.

Apolytikion of the Prophet Elias

The incarnate Angel, the Cornerstone of the Prophets, the second Forerunner of the Coming of Christ, the glorious Elias (Elijah), who from above, sent down to Elisha the grace to dispel sickness and cleanse lepers, abounds therefore in healing for those who honor him.

Brethren, I would have you know that the gospel which was preached by me is not man's gospel. For I did not receive it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through a revelation of Jesus Christ. For you have heard of my former life in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God violently and tried to destroy it; and I advanced in Judaism beyond many of my own age among my people, so extremely zealous was I for the traditions of my fathers. But when he who had set me apart before I was born, and had called me through his grace, was pleased to reveal his Son to me, in order that I might preach him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with flesh and blood, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were apostles before me, but I went away into Arabia; and again I returned to Damascus. Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas, and remained with him fifteen days. But I saw none of the other apostles except James the Lord's brother.

The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Luke

(16:19~31)

The Lord said, "There was a rich man, who was clothed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazaros, full of sores, who desired to be fed with what fell from the rich man's table; moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. The poor man died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's bosom. The rich man also died and was buried; and in Hades, being in torment, he lifted up his eyes, and saw Abraham far off and Lazaros in his bosom. And he called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy upon me, and send Lazaros to dip the end of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in anguish in this flame.' But Abraham said, 'Son, remember that you in your lifetime received your good things, and Lazaros in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in anguish. And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been fixed, in order that those who would pass from here to you may not be able, and none may cross from there to us.' And he said, 'Then I beg you, father, to send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they also come into this place of torment.' But Abraham said, 'They have Moses, and the prophets; let them hear them.' And he said, 'No, father Abraham; but if some one goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' He said to them, 'If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced if some one should rise from the dead'".

HCA HONORS TWO PARISHIONERS



The Hellenic Cultural Association of Utah (HCA) honored two parishioners of the Greek Orthodox Church Community of Utah at its annual AXIOS/AXIA Award and Membership lunch Sunday, Oct.23.

Recipient of the HCA's highest award – the AXIA Award – was Mrs. Victoria Peters for her exemplary volunteer work as an HCA member since 1986. Among her many achievements, Victoria created the HCA scrapbooks and developed the Hellenic Cuisine Academy. Victoria was also acknowledged for her decades-long

volunteer efforts which focused primarily on the well-being of school-age children.

Victoria joins a list of 43 other parish members and organizations who have received either the AXIOS or AXIA Award since its inception in 1992.

A native of Price, Utah, Constandinos (Deno) Himonas received a special award from the HCA in recognition of his numerous achievements in the state's legal and judicial system, highlighted by his seven years as a justice in the Utah Supreme Court. In his remarks, Deno noted that throughout his career he has always been proud to be a member of the Utah Greek community. In addressing the gathering, Deno said Utah must improve its legal system so that all citizens, regardless of their social or economic status, can have easy and affordable access to legal counsel.

The awards ceremony was attended by some 150 and was presided over by Jeannine Pappas Timothy, HCA president. She recapped the HCA's numerous activities of the past two years and said that during the community's 2022 Greek Festival the Hellenic Cultural Museum attracted 3,100-plus visitors.

Do you or an exceptional undergraduate student you know qualify to be a PanHellenic Scholar? The 2022/2023 application is now open and accepting applications!

APPLY TODAY!

The Foundation will accept applications from eligible Greek American college students and will distribute \$250,000 in scholarship awards to exceptional undergraduates as follows:

- Twenty (20) Awards of <u>\$10,000</u> based on academic achievement and financial need. (\$20,000 given specifically for students studying music or arts).
- Twenty (20) Awards of <u>\$2,500</u> based solely on academic achievement.

Undergraduate students of Hellenic descent from all fifty states are encouraged to apply. If a student applied in a prior year, and are still in college, we encourage them to reapply.

Applications should be submitted electronically as instructed by January 31, 2023.

To be eligible to apply for a scholarship, applicants must:
