

Saint Amphilochius, who was born in Cappadocia, shone forth in asceticism and divine knowledge even from his youth. He was consecrated Bishop of Iconium in 341, he struggled courageously against the blasphemies of Eunomius, Macedonius the enemy of the Holy Spirit, and the followers of Arius. He was present at the Second Ecumenical Council of the 150 Fathers, which took place in Constantinople, convoked during the reign of Theodosius the Great in the year 381. In 383 Amphilochius wished to persuade the Emperor Theodosius to forbid the Arians from gathering in Constantinople and to commit the churches to the Orthodox, but the Emperor was reluctant to do such a thing. The next time that Amphilochius entered the palace, he addressed Theodosius with proper honour, but slighted his young son Arcadius in his presence. Theodosius was indignant, and said the dishonour shown to his son was equally an insult to himself. To this Saint Amphilochius answered that as he would not suffer an insult to his son, so he ought to believe that God is wroth with those who blaspheme His Only-begotten. Saint Theodosius understood and admired Amphilochius' ingenious device, and he issued the desired edict in September of the same year. Saint Amphilochius, having reached deep old age, reposed in peace about the year 395. Saint Basil the Great wrote many letters to Saint Amphilochius, his friend and Fellow champion of the Faith, and at his request wrote his treatise On the Holy Spirit, which besides demonstrating the divinity of the Holy Spirit and His equality with the Father and the Son, defends the Church's unwritten ancient traditions, such as making the sign of the Cross, turning towards the East in prayer, no kneeling on Sunday, and so forth.

BYLAWS COMMITTEE

Proposed modifications for the definition of <u>Quorum</u> November 2022

Background

This Bylaws Committee was assembled at the request of the Parish Council in late October 2022 Bylaws Committee: Dimitri Gerontis, Marina Gianoulis, Kostas Katsohirakis, Harry Souvall, Jeannine Timothy.

What we are attempting to do:

Definition - Bylaws are the rules and procedures adopted by an organization for the government of its members and the regulation of its affairs. As an organization grows and develops, modifications to the bylaws become necessary to meet the organization's current needs regarding internal processes as well as voting, meetings and elections.

The Parish Board has determined our parish needs an amendment to our existing local parish Bylaws to modify the definition of a **quorum** necessary to vote on any transaction related to the purchase, sale or encumbrance of real property. The Board has asked this committee to present two amendment options which the parish will consider and, ultimately, vote upon.

Why we are doing this now:

It has been fifty years since our parish bylaws were last updated. The Parish Board seeks to amend our bylaws with an updated procedure to determine the quorum required for all votes pertaining to real property transactions. As always, all updated bylaws will conform with the Uniform Parish Regulations (UPRs).

This committee's goal is to develop two options to modify the definition of a quorum for all parish projects related to the purchase, sale or encumbrance of real property. Consequently, we looked to our own parish data to determine what number of votes we need, on any and every real property transaction presented at our general and special assemblies, to achieve an equitable parish vote.

We have researched the following data points:

- Average number of members in good standing who have attended and voted at each of the past fall General Assemblies over the past 5 years. 80-130
- Average number of members in good standing who have voted at Parish Board elections over the past 5 years. 250-300
- Approximate number of Steward Families at the end of 2021. 600
- Approximate number of Stewards eligible to vote. 850

Current definition of quorum:

A quorum shall number fifty (50) members in good standing for all regular and special parish assemblies. If a quorum is not present, the Parish Assembly may be called a second time within twenty-one days. As such time decisions may be taken by the number of members present with the exception of matters pertaining to the purchase, sale or encumbering of Parish real property in which two-thirds of all members in good standing will constitute a quorum.

Recommendations

The committee made certain recommendations. These were modified by the Parish Council to the following:

Option 1

(A) For transactions involving the purchase, sale or encumbrance of real property less than or equal to \$1,000,000 in value, the **quorum** shall consist of 50 members in good standing at a Parish Assembly.

(B) For transactions greater than \$1,000,000 in value, the **quorum** shall consist of 200 members in good standing at a Parish Assembly called for that purpose.

If a quorum is not present for (B), the Parish Assembly may be called a second time within twenty-one days. The parish shall send a certified letter to all members in good standing notifying them of this second assembly. At such time, a decision may be taken so long as there is a quorum of 50 members in good standing at the Parish Assembly. Only members who were eligible to vote in the first assembly will be eligible to vote in the second assembly.

Explanation of Option 1

The choice of a number instead of a percentage is to provide for the same system (set number) as has been used for all regular and special Parish Assemblies in the past. It is easy to count those present with a voting card. The higher number was chosen to recognize the importance of a greater number of members for important decisions without being so high as to make it difficult to conduct business. The number of 200 was chosen because attendance at fall assemblies has been between 80 and 130 and people voting in parish elections has been between 250 and 300. The number of 200 is an average of the two. The second assembly was lowered to the regular quorum so that the parish is able to conduct necessary business, should it not reach the 200-member threshold. The provision not allowing new voting members between assemblies is meant to encourage everyone wanting to vote to become a member in good standing at the first assembly.

Option 2

(A) For transactions involving the purchase, sale, or encumbrance of real property less than or equal to \$1,000,000 in value, the **quorum** shall consist of 50 members in good standing at a Parish Assembly.

(B) For transactions greater than \$1,000,000 in value, the **quorum** shall consist of two-thirds (2/3) of the number of Steward Families from the most recent year in good standing at a Parish Assembly

If a quorum is not present for (B), the Parish Assembly may be called a second time within twenty-one days. The parish shall send a certified letter to all members in good standing notifying them of this second assembly. At such time, a decision may be taken so long as there is a quorum of 200 members in good standing at the Parish Assembly.

Explanation of Option 2

Smaller transactions by definition have very limited impact on the life of our community, and they are transactional in nature typically involving the sale of a small piece of property that was donated to our parish. It seems reasonable to expect that we execute "ordinary-course" transactions with a smaller quorum. However, larger transactions will have an enormous impact on the life of our

community, with considerations that will affect us, our children, and their children long into the future. As a consequence, we owe it to ourselves to maintain a rigorous threshold for a quorum. The quorum should constitute a <u>community-wide</u> effort to approve large and complicated transactions versus major decisions being made by a small number of voting Stewards (minority). For large, complicated, impactful transactions we have a responsibility to ourselves to ensure broad-based attendance at such a voting Parish Assembly. We have many communication methods at our disposal, including word-ofmouth, old-fashioned phone trees, and advanced social media. As our community has demonstrated in recent years, we draw large numbers of attendees at our Festival, at weddings, at celebrations honoring clergy, and at other community-wide events. Stewards who live out-of-town have demonstrated a willingness and an ability to attend such events. A strong turnout and attendance should likewise be expected for proposed transactions that will impact our community for generations to come.

Definitions

- "Steward Families" shall mean any family or individual making a fair share pledge
- "Number of Steward Families" shall be provided by the Church Office/Parish Council Treasurer once a year, at the end of every calendar year, for that year. i.e., no later than December 21, 2021, for calendar year 2021, no later than December 31, 2022, for calendar year 2022, etc
- "Voting Stewards" shall mean any individual eligible to vote at a Parish Assembly or at Parish Elections

Illustrative Examples

- Husband, wife, three children, ages 15, 19, 26 One Steward Family, two members in good standing (two votes)
- Single person, age > 18
 One Steward Family, one member in good standing (one vote)
- Yiayia or Papou
 One Steward Family, one member in good standing (one vote)


